Video Transcript

Securing the Statue of Liberty





Presenter: Safety is priority number one for the country's highest symbol of freedom. The statue of liberty has been given a new digital security system as part of the renovations after Hurricane Sandy. Total Recall redesigned the surveillance system from top to bottom bringing together 9 state of the art technology vendors.

Capt. Greg Norman: What we try to accomplish here is to maintain comprehensive video footage and data for the parks operation for safety and security at the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. The new security system that we recently had installed was a donation by Total Recall and some of their dream team of partners that made this project a reality for us. It's a high tech, high definition digital surveillance system for our operations on Ellis Island and Liberty Island.

Presenter: DragonWave supplies packet microwave radio systems for the carrier class mobile and access networks.

Chris York: One of the key challenges with this project was to move the operation center from Liberty Island over to Ellis Island. At the same time by deploying all these high definition cameras, we are generating a lot of data traffic. There was a need for a very high capacity link between these two facilities. That's where DragonWave came in by supplying a Horizon Quantum high capacity point-to-point packet microwave system that delivers a 1.6 Gigabit per second (Gbps) wireless link between the two sites to carry all that traffic generated from the cameras over to the command center with a high degree of reliability and security.
